Sense of Place in Science Teaching Place is defined as any locality or space that has become imbued with meaning by human experience in it (Tuan, 1977). A spectrum of humanistic and scientific meanings may accrue to any given place, reflecting all of the ways that diverse individuals and groups know and experience it.
