Salivary Immunoglobulin A serves to aggregate oral bacteria such as *S. mutans* and prevent the formation of dental plaque. Tissue repair; Saliva can encourage soft tissue repair by decreasing clotting time and increasing wound contraction. Digestion; Saliva contains the enzyme amylase, which hydrolyses starch into maltose and dextrin.
